WELCOME...

2023 marked a new chapter for Somerset, and for The Octagon Theatre & Westlands Entertainment Venue, as we embarked on our journey as one of Arts Council England's National Portfolio Organisations, and of Somerset Council.

It is a pleasure to present the wonderful achievements we have since seen, including the smooth transition of The Octagon Theatre's programme to Westlands Entertainment Venue, and transformation of our Arts Engagement & Outreach Service for the 2023-24 financial year.

Over the year, we witnessed a truly unforgettable moment when The Octagon Theatre was gracefully "put to sleep" by a vibrant community cast of over 300 people, marking its closure at the end of April 2023 for an exciting redevelopment. It was a powerful celebration of the theatre's legacy, and I was delighted to experience it. Although the journey to transform The Octagon Theatre has faced its challenges, I'm pleased to report we're making progress (turn to page 11 for more details).

The year saw Westlands Entertainment Venue become a hub of activity, hosting the Yeovil Literary Festival and delivering festive cheer with the Christmas pantomime; The Octagon Theatre announced to lead the Music Hub for Somerset & Dorset from September 2024, bringing top-tier music education to the region; the growth of our Arts Engagement & Outreach programme with activities, events and performances delivered across the county that empower lives, reduce isolation and enhance wellbeing.

At Somerset Council we are passionate about nurturing the talents of our young people, embracing our rich heritage, and forging creative partnerships to secure a sustainable and vibrant cultural life in Somerset. We know our beautiful county is a great place to live, but we recognise the challenges our communities face, from rural isolation and areas of disadvantage to challenges around mental health and an ageing population. Culture has the power to connect our communities and positively contribute to and alleviate these issues, to make Somerset a better place to live, work and visit. The Octagon Theatre & Westlands Entertainment Venue continue to provide opportunities for residents to engage with creative arts from within our venues and in community spaces throughout the county.

We've been working hard to secure the future of services across our county, and that's meant finding new partners and ways to ensure their future success. Such as the devolution of Westlands Entertainment Venue to Yeovil Town Council in August 2024. We continue to work closely with our partners to ensure our residents have access to arts and culture and the many benefits they bring.

As you read through the achievements of the past 12 months, I hope you'll be inspired by how our Arts & Entertainment Service continues to enrich the lives of our residents through a diverse programme of performances, events, and activities. These shared experiences unite us all and offer something for everyone to enjoy and benefit from.

It also does not represent the number of tickets they bought or the number of times they visited.





YEOVIL LITERARY FESTIVAL

In 2023, we celebrated our eleventh year of Yeovil Literary Festival, with a stellar lineup of acclaimed authors, comedians, and celebrities, with the chance for audiences to discover new and emerging writers too.

Audiences were treated to captivating talks from household names like Sarah Beeny, Matt Lucas, Tommy Jessop, Deborah Meaden, Vaseem Khan, Michael Ball, and Alfie Boe. As a not-for-profit partnership between The Octagon Theatre, Westlands Entertainment Venue, Yeovil Waterstones, Yeovil Community Arts Association, and Somerset Libraries, the festival continues to be a cultural gem.

5,403 tickets were sold for 39 engaging events, making it a resounding success!

THE OCTAGON THEATRE UPDATE

The development of The Octagon Theatre continues to move forward with in principle funding from Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), Yeovil Town Council, our existing and ongoing fundraising, and other sources. Somerset Council remains responsible for managing and delivering the project, providing a contribution as support in kind

A revised Outline Business Case for the Octagon Theatre has been submitted to DCMS. The new case outlines a £15 million development project. The Project Team, led by Somerset Council, are in the process of appointing architects and a design team to take the revised project forward. The planned scheme includes a full refurbishment of The Octagon Theatre, ensuring we are fit to welcome future generations. Improvements will enhance accessibility both backstage and front of house, create a more environmentally sustainable operation, and upgrade the theatre's technical capabilities.

Throughout the year, we have continued to raise funds to support the redevelopment of our much-loved theatre through community productions, bucket collections, and 24-hour dance-a-thon's. Further contributions, including those raised by the Foyer Club Charity, grant funding, sponsorships, and donations, will be sought to help fund the project and bring this vision to life.





Cinderella stole the hearts of our audiences over Christmas 2023.

The "legendary" Octagon Theatre pantomime saw Cinderella go to the Ball...room at Westlands Entertainment Venue, with performances staged at Westlands whilst the Octagon remains closed for redevelopment.

Cinderella, proved to be a massive hit! Over 22, 000 people attended the 36 performances, all of which received rave reviews!

Panto will be back this December with the legendary tale of Jack and the Beanstalk, promising to be packed with music, laughter and magic!


- Live performances in **7** different community settings throughout the year.

Yeovil's Super Saturday

In 2023, Yeovil's Super Saturday event featured a show-stopping spectacle - a colossal 13-foot puppet that left audiences in awe! Autin Dance Theatre performed their enchanting production, *Out of the Deep Blue*, three times throughout the day, captivating families and shoppers in the heart of Yeovil's Town Centre.

The impact was undeniable - Quedam Shopping Centre reported a 23% increase in footfall compared to the previous year, with over 14,000 visitors in town. Local businesses thrived, with The Works celebrating "their busiest day since before Covid." The performance created a vibrant energy in the town, showing how we can entertain, inspire, and connect with audiences beyond our venues.

We are proud that our venues are at the 'heart' of the community in South Somerset, Many local groups and societies stage performances and events including Castaways Theatre Group, Motiv8 Productions, Yeovil Amateur Operatic Society. PARTICIPATE

Throughout the year we offer an exciting range of participation classes, workshops, summer schools and projects working alongside brilliant national touring companies and talented local artists.

From dance to arts and crafts we've got it covered, with opportunities for all ages and abilities to get involved across the county.

Unleashing creativity, connecting communities and nurturing talent across South Somerset

- Over 7,000 participations across our regular Octagon Academy Classes, with 18 weekly classes for participants aged 2 – 90.
- Over 220 children & young people taking part in creative activities during the school holidays.
- Over 500 participants from across the county took part in our community platforms, performing as part of A Festival of Song and SHiNE.





ARTS FOR HEALTH & WELLBEING

Creative activities that provide emotional and physical support to individuals with mental health and long-term health conditions, delivered in partnership with NHS trusts, community organisations, and voluntary services.

Projects include:

- Parkinson's Dance in Langport, a movement & dance project designed specifically to address the symptoms of Parkinson's.
- Movement Through Cancer in Yeovil, a creative movement & dance project designed specifically for people living with or at any point of their cancer journey.
- Time Together in Wincanton, a musicmaking project aimed at parents feeling low after the birth of their child.
- Somerset Wellbeing Orchestra in Chard, a music-making project aimed at adults who have reported mental health challenges or would like extra support.

Enriching lives and supporting health & wellbeing

- 57 specialist support-led Health & Wellbeing sessions delivered in community settings.
- ALL participants say the projects have positively impacted their lives.
- Improving health care professional's understanding of how creative arts can benefit the health and wellbeing of their patients.
- 2 local practitioners supported with training and mentorship in arts for health & wellbeing practices.

CREATIVE LEARNING & EDUCATION

Somerset schools are offered the opportunity to learn from, and collaborate with, world-class performance companies from across the UK. Our programme involves CPD for teachers, free in-school workshops for pupils, the opportunity to watch a performance by the company, and perform on The Octagon or Westlands stage.

Creative learning raising aspirations and building creative confidence in teachers

- 8 Somerset primary & secondary schools, delivering dance, theatre and music programmes with Wise Children, Motionhouse Dance, and Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra (BSO).
- **200 students** inspired by, and working alongside, world-class touring companies.
- 50 teachers supported to upskill.
- 2,600 students watched live professional performances.

Increased uptake in Drama GCSE

This year, one of our partnership schools, Preston School, a Business and Enterprise Academy, worked with Wise Children Theatre company and took part in their workshops and teacher training opportunities. Students were able to use the devising skills they developed in these sessions in their preparation for the practical elements of their Drama GCSE. The Head of Department was also keen to get Year 9 students involved in the workshops and as a result of the high-quality teaching and opportunities from this partnership, the uptake in students taking GCSE Drama for the next academic year has increased.



TALENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

To support talent development and inspire the next generation, we have designed a programme of activity to help young people find their path into the Creative Industries. We make career options within our venues visible (including Front of House, Box Office, Technical Theatre, Marketing, Programming, Events, and Arts Engagement & Outreach work) and nurture emerging artists.

Leading young people into the Creative Industries

- 60 year 7-9 students got to be producers, directors, performers, stage managers, lighting and sound designers for the day at our Creative Careers Event.
- Over 150 primary & secondary school students learnt about different jobs in the Creative Industries.
- 15 work experience students got hands-on experience and insight into running a receiving venue.

ARTIST SUPPORT

To support young people, emerging and established artists fulfil their potential and sustain creative careers here in Somerset, we offer a range of sector support with mentoring opportunities, apprenticeship schemes, training and networking events.

Nurturing & enabling artists to sustain creative careers in Somerset

- 86 hours of free studio hire for artists to create, rehearse and develop new work
- 40 artists receiving mentoring support and advice
- 6 Creative Commissions awarded to local artists & organisations to develop original work to reach people living in Somerset
- 3 Artist Blogs showcasing Somerset's creative & cultural practitioners
- 1 Technical Theatre Apprenticeship

ACCESS & INCLUSION

Our Accessible Ticket Scheme, SHiNE Bursary Fund, Octagon Buddies, and Octagon & Westlands Inclusion Group, supports individuals of all ages and abilities to attend, and take part in, creative participation classes, workshops, theatre shows and events, who might not be able to access the opportunity otherwise.

Our Access Schemes allow people within our community to flourish, be creative, feel valued and included.

Giving everyone the opportunity to experience the joy of the arts

- Free tickets to shows and events at our venues for low-income individuals.
- Subsidised places to our participation programme for anyone unable to otherwise afford the opportunity.
- Free buddy support for anyone who feels unable to attend shows and events on their own.
- Making improvements to access by directly hearing from disabled, D/deaf or neurodivergent people about the barriers they experience.

"The support that The Octagon Theatre & Westlands Entertainment Venue have been able to give my son through attending holiday activities and weekly classes has made such a difference. As a parent seeing your child suffer anxiety because of bullying is heartbreaking, the difference in him now is amazing. ENVIRONMENT

We recognise that the climate and ecological crises will be among the most significant challenges facing all of us over the coming decades. In response to the climate emergency, we are working to ensure sustainability is at the heart of decision-making and embedded within our everyday operations through training and localising our activity across South Somerset.

We have switched to renewable sources of energy and reduced our energy consumption by...

- Installing an air source heat pump at Westlands.
- All our house lights are LED and energy efficient.
- Installing light sensors.
- Reducing our business mileage by using local suppliers for food produce, cleaning and bar supplies.
- By delivering activity locally across South Somerset we are reducing the number of people having to travel to workshops or events which helps to lower carbon footprint.

Volunteers

Our venues and activities are brought to life by an incredible team of 70 dedicated volunteers. They are the heart of our success, helping us deliver inspiring programmes and creating unforgettable experiences for our audiences.

Over the past 12 months, our volunteers have generously given over 5,220 hours of their time to support our work. We couldn't do it without them!

A special shout-out goes to our Foyer Club, who handle Front of House duties - everything from taking tickets and showing customers to their seats to selling ice creams, confectionery, and merchandise. As a registered charity, they also play a vital role in fundraising for our venues, helping us continue to thrive.

We are truly grateful for the passion and commitment our volunteers bring, and we're proud to have them as part of our community.

"[My friend attended the show at the weekend.] She is partially sighted and came into the foyer on a frame with her daughter. She said a member of team with a headset and radio immediately spotted her in the busy crowd and pulled her to one side, checked her ticket and admitted her swiftly ahead of everyone else so she didn't have to deal with the rush of the crowd. Once in, the Foyer Club member came and checked on her several times throughout the show and interval to make sure she had everything she needed.
